Imansyah has worked with the Indonesian Financial Service Authority (IFSA) or Otoritas Jasa Keuangan (OJK) since 2013. Previously, he spent most of his career in the area of banking policy and regulation in Bank Indonesia by which he gained comprehensive experiences and understandings, not only in the area of banking standards but also risk management and risk-based supervision framework.

Starting 2013, he was assigned as the Head of The Strategic Policy Department of OJK before acting as the Deputy Commissioner of Strategic Management 1A in charge for the crisis management protocol, financial sector surveillance and research. Of works he completed including the issuance of the PPKSK Law, the World Bank/IMF Financial Sector Assessment Program (FSAP), and other international standard setters’ assessments.

In 2017, he was assigned as the Deputy Commissioner for Integrated Supervision by which financial conglomerate supervision and anti money laundering and combating financing for terrorism (AML/CFT) became additional responsibilities attached to him.

In 2018, he was assigned as the Deputy Commissioner of International Affairs and Research responsible for managing international issues including collaboration with international agencies (World Bank, IMF, IFC, IFSB, FSB, etc), AML/CFT and research as well as coordinating the surveillance, integrated data and integrated policy works in OJK acting as the Deputy Commissioner for Financial System Stability.

As of November 2020, he is the Deputy Commissioner of OJK Institute and Digital Finance responsible for capacity building for financial sector including research, and works related to digitalization in the financial sector.

He completed his master degree from the University of Western Sydney, Westmead majoring in banking and finance in 1997.
